

Ragnar Kjartansson

The Visitors

Sammlung Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst

January 28 – May 28, 2023

The Visitors, a video installation by Ragnar Kjartansson, sweeps viewers into the peculiar world of a historical villa on the Hudson River in Upstate New York. Against the picturesquely timeworn backdrop of the venerable Rokeby mansion, a group of friends have convened to play a song – the artist calls it a “feminine nihilistic gospel song”. Over 64 minutes of unbroken video recording, eight musicians and a choir perform a song based on text fragments collaged from works by artist Ásdís Sif Gunnarsdóttir that have been set to music by Kjartansson and Davíð Þór Jónsson. The projections each feature one musician in one of the mansion’s rooms and the choir on the veranda, the scenes and soundtracks merging into one all-encompassing filmic tableau. Conceived as a cinematographic and musical experiment, the live-filmed performance can also be viewed as a many-layered portrayal of friendship. *The Visitors* is a unique visual and acoustic composition, which gives poignant expression to the experiences of love and loss, separation and reunion.

While it can be viewed as a tribute to friendship, *The Visitors* also references ABBA. The title echoes the Swedish pop band’s eponymous 1981 album, their last, which is strongly influenced by their subsequent breakup. Produced in 2012 for his solo show at the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst, *The Visitors* brought Kjartansson international recognition and is considered an outstanding example of his artistic approach. In his long-lasting performances, he uses repetitions and continuous loops to explore the shifts in musical performances over an extended period of time, as the musicians’ fatigue grows and becomes discernible especially in their voices. In *The Visitors*, Kjartansson also lets us partake very directly in the work’s process of creation, inviting us to immerse ourselves in an intensely emotional artistic experience.

Ragnar Kjartansson (*1976, lives and works in Reykjavík) most recently appeared on stage in Switzerland with the performance *Schmerz* at the Zürcher Theater Spektakel festival (2022). *The Visitors* was produced for his solo exhibition at the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst in 2012 and has since been shown in many international art venues – most recently at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, San Francisco and at the TBA21 Thyssen-Bornemisza Art Contemporary, Madrid (both in 2022); the V-A-C Foundation’s GES-2, Moscow (2021-2022); the High Museum of Art, Atlanta (2021); the Institute of Contemporary Art, Boston (2020); and the Museum of Contemporary Art Kiasma, Helsinki (2019-2020). Kjartansson’s works have been shown in major institutions such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Barbican in London and the Palais de Tokyo in Paris.
